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Staffordshire County Council ICT Provisions for Members



The document below is a copy of a guidance note which is sent out to Staffordshire County Council Members following their election. It outlines in basic detail the types of ICT equipment (and estimated costs) that are offered to County Councillors for the period of their tenure.

How do I choose the best device for me?

The County Council want you to choose the device that works for you. To help you make that decision, the table below lists the advantages/disadvantages of each device on offer to you.

Anyone using their own device will need to access the Citrix Gateway. Citrix is simply a way of remotely accessing Staffordshire County Council Services. It doesn't need you to have anything special installed on your pc it is accessed through a web link.

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Printers

We can provide you with either a standard printer if required. We will also provide you with consumables which include printer cartridges and paper. This will also apply if you choose to use your own printer.

If you do choose to use your own printer and are using the Citrix Gateway you need to be aware that some printers will not work with Citrix. Before you make your decision, if you let us have the make and model of your printer we will check whether or not it will work.

There are also printers available for you to use in your local library, County Buildings and Staffordshire Place.

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Telephones

Members will want to be accessible. As you spend a lot of time on the move you may, therefore, prefer to make a mobile telephone available for contact with officers and the public.

County Council Supported Smartphone/Mobile Phone

We can provide you with a smartphone to access your Emails, Calendar and the Internet.

The phone will allow you to access the internet and make calls and send texts in respect of your county council business.

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Tip - If you wish we can set this phone up to transfer to your personal phone so that you do not have to carry two phones with you when you are out and about. [If you would like to use this facility we will issue you with a mobile phone rather than a smart phone, thus minimising cost].

If you choose to have a County Council smartphone/mobile phone you will not be reimbursed for your line rental on the telephone line in your home.

Broadband connection

To enable connection to the County Council network at home, members will need access to the Internet. If you do not already have a broadband connection then you will need to arrange for this to be installed. Advice and assistance on how this can be done is available.

The county council will refund broadband line rental up to the value of **£200** per annum, on the production of a recent receipt.

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
