- 1.1 At the time of writing (2/9/15), 21 applications have been received from 9 Locally Based Bodies at a total of £13,113.01.
- 1.2 8 applications have received the full amount applied for, 10 received a grant below the applied amount, 1 received no grant, and 2 are pending. Grants totalling £9,877.84 have been issued.
- 1.3 One application has been received from a Locally Based Body that requires Panel decision.

2. <u>Issues</u>

2.1 To date, £33,122.16 of the budget remains unspent – 77% of the budget. Six of the LBBs have spent none of their allocation.

2.3 An application has been received from Keele Parish Council – as a Locally Based Body, they cannot make a recommendation and the application is referred to the Grants Assessment Panel for decision:-
