1.1 The Small Grants budget for 2016/17 is £16,000.00.

1.2 Voluntary & Community groups can apply for a grant of up to £1,500.00.

1.3 Three eligible Small Grant applications have been received for consideration at this meeting, at a total of £4,201.12. This would leave a closing negative balance of -£1,686.14.

1.4 The Community Chest budget is £43,000.00. To date 44 grants at a total of £24,387.54 have been issued leaving a balance of £18,612.46 in the budget.

1.5 One Community Chest application for £800.00 has been received from a Locally Based Body which requires Panel decision.

1.8 The Green Grants scheme has a budget of £3,200.00, and provides grants of up to £200.00 for environmental projects. As of 6th February 2017, 7 grants at a total of £1,374.00 had been approved and issued leaving £1,826.00 in the budget.

To prevent further damage to the maps, but increase public access the Museum, in partnership with the Friends of Brampton Museum and the Library Service have applied for a Sharing Heritage Grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund. A 'research team' of local residents will be supported in researching the maps and placing them in the cultural and historical context and the results of this research will be communicated through a number of public lectures. This Cultural Grant funding will be used to support an element of this project – a Poet in Residence project . Staffordshire's Poet Laureate - Bert Flitcroft, whose aim is to encourage more people in Staffordshire to get involved in and enjoy poetry and create newly commissioned work will be based at the Museum during the Spring and Summer 2017. The residency will consist of twelve free sessions – at the museum and in sheltered housing and with adult learners - in which Bert will use the map collection (and local photographs and artefacts) to engage the public and initiate discussions where people can express their thoughts and feelings about the maps in their historical and cultural context and any possible relevance for to-day. The aim of the project is to create a sense of place.
