the locality, with the prospect of continuing to provide this for many years. The Order was made and served on 6<sup>th</sup> October 2014 in order to protect the long term well-being of the tree. No representations were received.

Your officers are of the opinion that making the Tree 3.4 Preservation Order will ensure protection of the tree and secure its longer-term visual amenity. Your officers are of the opinion that the tree, is generally healthy at present and is of sufficient amenity value to merit the making of a Tree Preservation Order. It is considered to be an appropriate species for the locality and to provide public amenity value due to its form and visibility from adjacent public locations. The making of the Order will not prevent the owner from carrying out good management of the tree, it will give the Council the opportunity to control the works and prevent unnecessary felling or lopping. The owner will be able to apply for permission to carry out maintenance work to the tree and if in the future the tree does deteriorate in condition the owner will be able to apply for permission to carry out work which is necessary to safely manage the tree.
