This access to both collections is severely restricted due to the fragility of the older maps, their size and for some, such as the unique cholera map of Newcastle further physical handling is likely to have severe detrimental effects. To prevent further damage to the maps, but increase public access the Museum, in partnership with the Friends of Brampton Museum and the Library Service have applied for a Sharing Heritage Grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund. This funding will be used to ensure the survival of the maps through digitisation . A 'research team' of local residents will be supported in researching the maps and placing them in the cultural and historical context and the results of this research will be communicated through a number of public lectures. This Cultural Grant funding will be used to support an element of this project – a Poet in Residence project . Staffordshire's Poet Laureate - Bert Flitcroft, whose aim is to encourage more people in Staffordshire to get involved in and enjoy poetry and create newly commissioned work will be based at the Museum during the Spring and Summer 2017. The residency will consist of twelve free sessions – at the museum and in sheltered housing and with adult learners - in which Bert will use the map collection (and local photographs and artefacts) to engage the public and initiate discussions where people can express their thoughts and feelings about the maps in their historical and cultural context and any possible relevance for to-day. The aim of the project is to create a sense of place. They are applying for funding towards The Spectrum Show which will take place in February and March 2017.
