09/114/FUL	Ground floor link extension. Turner House, Main Road, Betley. Mr A Sumner.	No objections subject to careful control over materials and detailing to match existing in accordance with Policies B9 and B10 of the Newcastle-under-Lyme Local Plan. Request that conditions be attached in relation to this.
09/143/FUL	Single storey rear extension. Keele Lodge, Keele University. Prof M Andrews.	The Conservation Advisory Working Party strongly objected to the proposed extension in its current form, for the reasons outlined in Policy B6 of the Newcastle-under-Lyme Local Plan.
		Members welcomed the applicant's attempt to improve the property by removing the brick extensions with a 'quality' approach. However, it was felt that the proposal did not fit in with the design of the Victorian building. Request that further discussions be entered into to retain the quality of this very important building.
09/157/FUL	Access track. Bridge Farm, London Road, Knighton. Nuon UK Ltd.	Members stood by their comments made on application 08/360/FUL at the meeting held on 10 June 2008 – "No comments".

# 822. \* BUTTERTON CHURCH

At a previous meeting of this Working Party, concerns had been raised regarding damp inside the Church. The Chair had corresponded with representatives from the Church and a response had been received. This had been passed to the Council's Conservation Officer who would report her findings to the next meeting of this Working Party.

#### 823. \* LAND REAR OF ST LUKE'S CHURCH, SILVERDALE

Members were advised that this application had been approved at Planning Committee. A condition had been attached to retain the platforms and a suggestion made to take down and restore the signal posts/arms and relocate them near to the platforms.

There appeared to be several unresolved issues, one of which was that of the tarmac surfacing material being used down to Crown Street. This Working Party had requested the use of a 'sensibily designed' finish and not tarmac. The Chair would approach Planning Officers to discuss these matters.
