





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Application for Financial Assistance (Historic Buildings Grants) from the Conservation and Heritage Fund - Queen Victoria Statue, Queens Gardens, Newcastle (Ref: 11/12001/HBG)

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Working Party recommends that the Planning Committee accept accepts these changes and revised costs and that it approves a grant of £1,535 for the Queen Victoria Statue, subject to the appropriate standard conditions.

Purpose of report

To consider an application for financial assistance towards the cost of the restoration and conservation of this Grade II listed statue in Newcastle Conservation Area.

The application for grant aid is for the restoration and repair of the fabric of the statue situated in Queens Gardens, a Grade II listed building. In 2011 the Council's Landscape Development Section applied for Heritage Lottery funding to upgrade the Gardens and restore the statue using funding from the HBG Fund to match the bid. This bid was not successful and the future of any bids for the Gardens is unknown at present. The statue however still requires repairing.

The Newcastle Civic Society now wishes to restore the statue, in memory of one of their key founder members. This report seeks agreement to the change in applicant for the grant from the Council to the Civic Society and also to agree the revised amount from the chosen contractor who provided the lowest quote.

The original quotation was £8,910 in 2011 when VAT was at a rate of 15%. An up to date quotation has now been received and the cost of repair work is now quoted at £6,978 including VAT. The statue has not deteriorated in the last 2 years. The Landscape Division has agreed to supervise the work on behalf of the Civic Society at a rate of 10%. The total cost of the works would accordingly be £7,675.80 which meant that a grant of 20% or £1,535 could be offered according to the terms of the Historic Buildings Grant scheme. Work is expected to begin in the autumn and will take approximately one week.

Financial Implications

There is sufficient funding to meet this grant application of which £1,960 is already committed and agreed expenditure. The actual cost of the works has decreased in the interim, and the £1,535 can be covered as there is approximately £55,000 presently unallocated in the Fund.

Conclusions

The principle of supporting this conservation work to the statue has already been established. This grant application meets all the Council's criteria for the repair and restoration of the heritage asset and supporting the application would help deliver the Council's statutory duty to preserve and enhance buildings of special architectural or historic interest. The views of the Conservation Advisory Working Party will be reported to the Planning Committee who will make the decision on whether or not to award the grant.

Application for Financial Assistance (Historic Buildings Grants) from the Conservation and Heritage Fund – Holy Trinity Church, Church Street, Chesterton, (Ref: 13/14006/HBG)

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Working Party recommends that the Planning Committee approves a grant of £10,000 for roof repairs, replacement and stabilisation of stone capping, new gutters, stone dressing and re-pointing at Holy Trinity Church, Church Street, Chesterton, subject to the appropriate standard conditions.

Purpose of report

To consider an application for financial assistance towards the cost of the restoration of the roof of this Church which is a vulnerable Grade II Listed Building.

Introduction

The Church has been trying to raise the funding and get agreement for these repairs for many years. The Church quinquennial (5 yearly) report over 10 years ago stressed the importance of getting the roof work undertaken. It is a positive step forward that the Parochial Church Council are now in a position to begin the work. This grant application involves repairs to the roof, re-bedding of the ridge tiles and flashings. The stone cappings require replacement and stabilisation in some places. Other works include new gutters and rainwater goods, stone dressing and re-pointing, redecoration of woodwork, and work to lancet windows. Work has been tendered by a conservation accredited architect who has provided the specification and who will oversee the work.

The cost of the work plus £10,000 recommended contingency, which may not be required, including VAT is £80,128.34 of which all is eligible work. As the structure is a Listed Building, the work is eligible for a grant of 20% of the cost or up to a maximum of £10,000 – a figure which applies in this case. The Church community has managed to raise the rest of the funds required for the work. The contractor is standing by to begin on site early September.

Financial Implications

There is sufficient funding to meet this grant application with approximately £55,000 in the Fund, which allows for commitments.

Conclusions

This Church is vulnerable not least due to the decreasing congregation, lack of an incumbent as well as the physical effects of the problems with the roof. However it does have a dedicated and concerned church warden. The work required is urgently necessary and should be carried out as soon as possible. The views of the Conservation Advisory Working Party will be reported to the Planning Committee who will make the decision on whether or not to award the grant.

Application for Financial Assistance (Historic Buildings Grants) from the Conservation and Heritage Fund – 4 Highway Lane, Keele, (Ref: 13/14006/HBG)

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Working Party recommends that the Planning Committee approves a grant of a sum to be advised for the repair and refurbishment to the external envelope including the windows, roof, walls, chimneys and rainwater goods at 4 Highway Lane, Keele, subject to the appropriate standard conditions.

Purpose of report

To consider an application for financial assistance towards the cost of the repair of this property which is on the Council's Register of Locally Important Buildings and which lies within the Keele Village Conservation Area

Introduction

An application has been received for a grant for works of repair and refurbishment to the external enveloper including the windows, roof, walls, chimneys and rainwater goods of this property. The property is not included on the Statutory List of buildings of special architectural or historic interest, but it is on the Council's Register of Locally Important buildings and structures and it lies within the Keele Village Conservation Area.

This application has only very recently been received. The agents have requested that this application be processed as a matter of urgency as the client and contractor wish to start work as soon as possible. The item is placed on the agenda of the Working Party in the absence of the Council's Conservation Officer who will upon her return and prior to the meeting of the Working Party provide a supplementary report to the Working Party on this application.

The cost of the work which the applicant's agent considers may be eligible, including VAT, is £27,851.48. Grants are eligible principally for the repair of structural fabric (roofs, walls, etc) or features of special historic interest (e.g. sash windows, decorative plasterwork, panelling), and the Council's policy is only to fund redecoration where it is for the redecoration of a historically significant scheme. A significant part of the works indicated in the Schedule of works does comprise either decoration or redecoration and the Conservation Officer will advise as to whether she considers such works are eligible in this case, and if not what the total cost of the works which are eligible will be.

As a building on the Register of Locally Important buildings lying within a Conservation Area, works eligible for grant funding would normally be the subject of a 10% grant offer.

Financial Implications

There is sufficient funding to meet this grant application with approximately £55,000 in the Fund, which allows for commitments.

Conclusions

The views of the Conservation Advisory Working Party will be reported to the Planning Committee who will make the decision on whether or not to award the grant.
