2. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS

3. **PREVIOUSLY CONSIDERED APPLICATIONS**

The officer presented one application which had been previously considered by the Chair. 19/00003/FUL - 60 Ironmarket was considered by the Chair on 12th February 2019. She concluded she had no objections to the proposal. The group accepted her recommendations.

4. **NEW APPLICATIONS RECEIVED**

Resolved: That the following observations be made on the applications listed below:-

Newcastle under Lyme School, Newcastle, adjacent to Victoria Road, 19/00042/FUL

Working Party accepts that the clean and modern approach is the best way to mitigate the impact of the large building. The simpler the building the more invisible it will become. The issue of the rainwater goods was raised and the assumption made that they must be internal as well as the importance of dealing with run off, especially on the timber elevation. The issue of signage and directions for the new facility was also raised which could have an impact on the Conservation Area.

23 and 11 Bridge Street, Newcastle 19/00105/FUL

The Working Party has no objections.

Weaverlea House, Izaac Walton Way, Madeley 19/00101/FUL

The Working Party has no objections.

Land adjacent to Mayfield, Church Lane, Betley 19/00080/FUL

The Working Party strongly objects to the design, layout and scale of the proposal, which is directly adjacent to Betley Conservation Area, as harmful to the historic village setting. The plot is set at a high level and any development should be more recessive and honest. The design is inappropriately ostentatious and unlike a late 18th Century house which it purports to mimic. The other adjacent buildings within the Conservation Area are more recessive and it represents a poor contextual approach and will have an oppressive presence in the village. Pastiche on this grandiose scale is an inappropriate imposition on the Conservation Area.

Old Vicarage, Haddon Lane, Maer 18/00705/FUL & 18/00706/LBC

The Working Party accepted that some improvements had been made to the proposal by centralising the doors, reducing the size and simplifying the joinery details. The Working Party still feels that the roof lantern needs to sit lower to make this acceptable.

5. CONSERVATION AND HERITAGE FUND

18/19004/HBG – The Beehive, Main Road, Betley

The Working Party fully supports the giving of this grant. Cruck framed buildings are rare within this Borough and of great significance and therefore the conservation of such buildings are important.

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Application for Financial Assistance (Historic Buildings Grants) from the Conservation and Heritage Fund – Betley Court, Main Road, Betley (Ref: 18/19005/HBG)

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Working Party indicate its views on proposals going to the Planning Committee for:-

1. £423 Historic Building Grant to repair the flat roof bay window and a sash window on the southern elevation, subject to the appropriate standard conditions

Purpose of report

To inform the Working Party of applications for financial assistance towards the cost of repairs to the flat roof over the bay window in the main living room which is leaking and to the sash window on the southern elevation, which is rotten, and give the Working Party an opportunity to express its views on the application.

Betley Court is a Grade II* Listed Building built by G Wilkinson but has alterations by John Nash. The 18th Century house is built from brick with slate roof. The bow window on the south elevation is attributed to Nash. This flat roof on top of the bow window is leaking and causing damage internally to the cornice. Additionally a number of windows need some attention on the southern elevation but the one proposed for repair is the worst affected. It currently does not open and elements have rotted.



The owner has received 3 quotations for the work which is estimated to cost \pounds 2,113.80 including VAT.

The works are eligible for a grant of up to 20% or up to a maximum of £5,000.

Financial Implications

There is sufficient funding to meet this grant application with \pounds 18,788 in the Fund; allowing for commitments. This Fund will receive additional funding of \pounds 10,000 on 1 April 2019.
