Reasons for objection to the application for a variation to a premises licence in relation to the Offley Arms Madeley by Joules Brewery Limited.

The entrance to Waterside Close is a narrow residential access, offering limited manoeuvring space and visibility. It is not intended, equipped or adequately proportioned for use as a public leisure space, a formal or informal business access point, a public vehicular parking area, or an area for public vehicular turning.

The inappropriate creation of a public leisure space within the residential entrance to Waterside Close would predictably generate a significant amount of vehicular traffic and public footfall in an area that is not intended to accommodate either.

Legitimate concerns regarding noise pollution, antisocial behaviour and other such inevitable and detrimental impacts upon the immediate residential environment aside, the significantly increased risk of road traffic collisions involving vehicles and pedestrians that such inappropriate usage would create is unsafe, unnecessary and unacceptable.

The significant likelihood that such risks would be magnified by the recreational consumption of alcohol should be of prime concern in this specific instance, particularly when a far safer and previously utilised alternative location for such outdoors activity already exists on the opposite side of the business property in question, safely outwith the residential entrance to Waterside Close.

The speculative overreach represented by the development work and application in question constitutes inconsiderate, inappropriate and foreseeably unsafe use. It is extremely likely that predictable and highly attributable negative outcomes would arise from such misuse of the residential entrance to Waterside Close.

In the hope that such may be avoided, I hereby formally object to the application in question in the strongest possible terms.

Re: Application for a variation to a premises Licence in relation to the Offley Arms Madeley by Joules Brewery Limited.

I wish to make an objection in respect of the above application on the grounds of Public Nulsance and Public Safety.

Public nuisance.

- The proposed area is intended to be used as a beer garden and public meeting space. It is adjacent to the entrance to a domestic housing area and at the entrance to Waterside Close. The inherent character of a beer garden is that there will be a large amount of noise in the evenings, particularly on fine evenings. If parties and other events take place this will certainly result in great noise and disruption to the lives of local home owners. This is not acceptable in what, until now has been a quiet residential area, which is why many of us came to live here.
- Joules have removed vegetation (including trees and bushes), knocked down a large section of an old c.6ft brick boundary-wall & laid hard core to enable them to create a beer garden. This has already affected the appearance of the entrance to the Close. This has been done without planning permission which will have to be applied for retrospectively.
- The area in question is immediately adjacent to the only pedestrian path into the Close and therefore anyone walking home will have to pass the potential noise and disruption as well as being subject to drifting cigarette smoke and vaping plumes.
- It is also likely that children and others will spill onto the pavement and road further adding to the noise.
- This land was recently acquired by the new owner and therefore all home owners in Waterside Close could not be aware of this when moving to the Close. The impact on the entrance to the Close could well reduce the attractiveness to people considering buying here

Public safety

- The beer garden will encourage people to the Waterside Close road side of the pub which will hinder sight lines for homeowners or visitors entering or leaving the Close by vehicle.
- It is also probable that as car parking at the pub is extremely limited pub customers will park adjacent to the beer garden meaning that entry and exit from the Close will become dangerous, particularly if adults, and more particularly children, are present.
- Car parking in the Close is already at a premium and the temptation will be for pub visitors to park either in the entrance or in the homeowners' spaces potentially leading to conflict.

The building is in the process of being restored in a manner consistent for a property within a conservation area ,and which at present enhances the area and has so far been completed in a sympathetic manner.

However I wish to make an objection to the following:-

- Application [or lack of] by Joules brewery for a change to premises in relation to recently acquired land to side of the main building.
- Application [proposed] for change to licensing /entertainment restrictions in relation to the public house and beer garden.

My objections are on the grounds of Public Nuisance and Public Safety. Bearing in mind that the residential area to the side and behind the Offley Arms is at present a quiet residential location with a population who brought property here for that very reason and now see it under threat.

Public Nuisance:

- If these applications go ahead there will be a significant increase in noise pollution especially in the afternoon and evening. The residents of the above mentioned area have a right under the 'Rights under Noise and Statutory Nuisance Act 1993, which needs to be taken into consideration at all levels.
 This objection could also be applicable to Public safety as it is bound to cause consternation and possibly antagonism in the area.
- As the only pavement is adjacent to the proposed beer garden any pedestrian would be in direct contact by its very nature with the various forms of pollution generated by presence of a beer garden.

Public Safety:

- The designated beer garden has the potential for serious public safety issues to arise. I refer you to the incident and consequences of the misuse of a similar sized beer garden ,the Crown and Anchor, in Stone over the summer. Do we want that here?
- Access to and from the close to the main road is already an issue due to work vans etc parked on main road, this can be extremely dangerous and will only be increased by the inevitable misuse of the access road by people who cannot or will not use the car park due to its being used for entertainment purposes or it has houses on it!
- While parking isn't entirely relevant at this point I would like to flag up the fact that a council official from Newcastle Borough previously ruled that parking in the close was in adequate for residents and consequently blocked a planning application. It certainly doesn't have any spare capacity for customers of the Offley Arms and could cause public safety issues and must be avoided at all cost.

If these applications are passed they will have very little or no implications for the economy but severe implications for residents of Waterside Close.

- I have no issue with the original demise of the Offley Arms, including the external area adjacent to car park being permitted the extended hours.

Suggestions: -

- I personally have no objections to the new "beer garden", but I believe that the licencing hours, within the new "beer garden" should be set to a more reasonable:
 - o Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday 1100hrs to 2200hrs
 - Friday and Saturday 1100hrs to 2300hrs
 - Sunday 1200hrs to 2200hrs
- Possibly make the new "beer garden" child and family friendly, banning smoking and vaping.

Public Nuisance:

- It is intended that the proposed area will be used as a beer garden and public meeting space. It is adjacent to the entrance to a domestic housing area, at the entrance to Waterside Close. The associated character of a beer garden is that there will be a large amount of noise in the evenings, particularly on finer evenings. Parties, music and entertainment will certainly result in a significant level of noise and disruption to the lives of local home owners. This is not acceptable in what, until now, has been a very quiet residential area, and the reason I came to live here in the first place. This pub is not situated in the middle of a town full of commercial properties where significant noise levels may be more acceptable;
- The application also includes a request for extended opening hours and for outside entertainment and live music. This further increases the problem described above and is totally unacceptable in the middle of an otherwise quiet residential area. It should also be noted that this appears to be in total contradiction to sections 8 to 18 in the application where the applicant has answered NO to all changes listed;
- Joules have already removed trees and bushes, knocked down a large section of an old c.6ft brick boundary-wall and laid hard core to enable them to create the beer garden. This has already affected the appearance of the entrance to Waterside Close. This has been done without planning permission which will have to be applied for retrospectively. That is outrageous and Joules seem to be showing us that they have the Council over a barrel;
- Whilst undertaking this work, the contractors have so severely damaged a large mature tree, the local authority have determined it is unsafe and must be taken down. This destruction of a lovely old tree was unnecessary, especially as work should not have commenced yet. It has made many residents query whether this has been a deliberate act to ensure there is more space for the proposed beer garden;
- The area in question is immediately adjacent to the only pedestrian path into Waterside Close and therefore anyone walking home will have to pass the potential noise and disruption, as well as being subject to drifting cigarette smoke and vape plumes (and not to mention cannabis as has been observed in the past with this pub)

- It is also likely that children and others will spill onto the pavement and road further adding to the noise level;
- This land was recently acquired by the new pub owner and therefore all home owners in Waterside Close could not be aware of this when moving to the Close. The impact on the entrance to Waterside Close could reduce the attractiveness to people considering buying here. I do not have any objection to the pub itself it was open when I bought my property. However, there was no beer garden and people generally gathered outside the side door to the left of the pub (as you look at it from the road) if they wanted to be outside. As this paved gathering area is small, it naturally limited the amount of people able to be there at once and therefore the noise and nuisance was kept to a minimum.

Public Safety:

- The beer garden will encourage people to the Waterside Close side of the pub which will hinder sight lines for homeowners or visitors entering or leaving Waterside Close by vehicle, impacting upon public safety;
- It is also probable that, as car parking at the pub is extremely limited, pub customers will park adjacent to the beer garden. Entry and exit from Waterside Close will become dangerous as cars turn in. We have already encountered this with commercial vehicles being parked there and immediately outside the pub;
- Car parking in Waterside Close is already at a premium and the temptation will be for pub
 visitors to park either in the entrance to the close or in the homeowners' private spaces,
 potentially leading to conflict.

As I have said above, I have no objection to the pub re-opening. However, I do object to the beer garden and am very disappointed that Joules have ploughed on with clearing the space for it (including 'accidently' damaging an established mature tree) without gaining planning permission first. That in itself seems to indicate that there is an assumption that the Council will just approve it because it's been done, or that they have the Council over a barrel. This is akin to a builder starting to build a house without planning permission; it is out of order and makes a mockery of the planning application process.

Interestingly, Joules have claimed on a recent Offley Arms Facebook post that they have consulted with the pub's neighbours regarding the beer garden - I guess I must have been out when they knocked on my door! It appears that a fair few other neighbours were also out at the same time - a blatant lie to mislead people on a public forum.

I wish to make an objection in respect of the above application on the grounds of **Public Nuisance and Public Safety.**

I have lived here for almost 20 years which I bought my property for my retirement. Most of the residents are in retirement and bought for the same reason. Being somewhere quiet to live in a very beautiful part of Madeley Village made up of Mews Houses, also being opposite the pool, and has all the amenities in the Village for retirement and on a Public Bus Route too. Peace and tranquillity to enjoy!

Prior to the close being developed this was agricultural land belonging to Pool Farm, as a working farm the land owned for many years by the same family called Bedsons. As to which the garden in question would only be for residential use, and not commercial which is now being requested for change of use. The land is registered with NUL Planning as residential use.

The area they have purchased was a private garden belonging to a resident in Waterside Close, which had vegetation including trees and bushes. to which Joules have removed, and started building work on their supposedly beer garden without planning permission, also in the process have disturbed a Sycamore Tree, to which the council have told them that it is unsafe and has to be taken down, we are all devastated.

Public Nuisance

- The original proposed request was to be a beer garden and meeting place. But their application now also requests for outside entertainment and live music and extended opening hours! which is totally unacceptable in the middle of a residential area.
- The area is adjacent to a public footpath leading into Waterside Close.
 The residents living there will have to walk past potential noise and music

- It is also likely that Children and others will spill onto the pavement and road further adding to noise and disruption, which will be dangerous too.
- This has cause great distress and upset to the people living in the Close, we don't deserve this to happen, all you want when you get older is a quiet life, we thought we were safe here, please give us a bit of thought and respect when making your decisions

Public Safety

- Even though they have parking for 20 cars on the car park of the Offley Arms. It very much concerns me, as to previously when it was operating as a Pub people would park their cars in Waterside close entrance. As to which caused poor visibility when leaving the Close, which will become dangerous and could cause accidents...
- Especially if more adults and children are present.
- You also found cars parking on the road on the front of the Offley Arms
 to which obscured the view when leaving Waterside Close. Which will be
 an accident waiting to happen. There is also Bus stop outside the front
 door of The Offley Arms to consider
- Car parking in the close is already very limited and the temptation will be for the pub visitors to park in the entrance or in the "homeowners" spaces. Which will not be acceptable, as the Offley Arms, have their own parking?
- Because of the road parking issues the council may have to consider putting double yellow lines.
