This followed in unannounced inspection on the 19 <sup>th</sup> June by the Environment Agency. The A found that there had been a failure to install temporary clay capping to the lanks of Phases 1,2,3 & 4 and concluded that `there could be a significant impact on quality of life if not addressed promptly and adequately. `WQL ssued a statement saying they did not accept these findings and will shallenge them directly with the E.A.
